Mumbai Climate Week 2027 to return in February with a bigger, broader and more citizen-led climate action agenda



* Chief Minister Devendra Fadnis on Thursday, 14th May 2026, formally released the Impact Report of the Mumbai Climate Week 2026 and also announced the dates of the second edition of MCW, planned by Project Mumbai in February 2027. He was accompanied by all his cabinet colleagues, both the Deputy Chief Ministers, Chief Secretary, Government of Maharashtra and Environment secretary, along with team Project Mumbai led by Co founder and CEO Shishir Joshi, Board member Ridham Desai and head of Projects Dharmaraj Solanki.

Mumbai, 15th May 2026: The Hon'ble Chief Minister of Maharashtra announced the second edition of Mumbai Climate Week (MCW), which will return from **23–26 February 2027 at the Jio World Convention Centre, Mumbai**. India's platform dedicated to accelerating climate action and catalysing solutions for the Global South, MCW will build on the momentum of its inaugural edition with a stronger focus on collective and citizen-led climate action.





An initiative of Project Mumbai, in partnership with the Government of Maharashtra, MCW 2027 will build on the momentum of its inaugural edition to create a wider platform for collective climate action — bringing together policymakers, businesses, investors, civil society organisations, academia, innovators, youth, community leaders and, most importantly, citizens.

The second edition will expand beyond conventional climate conversations to explore how *climate action intersects with the way people live, eat, move, work, create, play and experience the city*. The programme will continue to focus on practical, scalable solutions relevant to Mumbai, India and the wider Global South, while strengthening the role of citizens and communities in shaping the climate future of the city.

“Climate action cannot remain the responsibility of a few institutions or experts. It has to become a shared responsibility — something that citizens, communities, businesses, governments and institutions can see themselves as part of. The response to the first edition made it clear that there is a strong appetite for continued and collective action. MCW 2027 will build on that momentum, go deeper into solutions and take the conversation into more aspects of everyday life,” said **Shishir Joshi, Founder, Mumbai Climate Week and Founder & CEO, Project Mumbai**.

WHAT’S NEW AT MUMBAI CLIMATE WEEK 2027

Five flagship themes, with two new areas of focus

MCW 2027 will expand its thematic focus from Urban Resilience, Food Systems and Energy Transition to five flagship themes, **adding Circularity and Biodiversity** as new areas of focus.

The five themes — Urban Resilience, Food Systems, Energy Transition, Circularity and Biodiversity — will anchor the 2027 programme, alongside cross-cutting conversations on climate finance, technology and innovation, public health, gender and inclusion, youth, education and green skills, international cooperation, and citizen action.

The 2027 edition will also place citizens and communities more centrally within the climate conversation, creating greater opportunities for participation and engagement beyond the main conference.

Climate action will be explored through a broader range of lenses, including Food, Health, Gender, Art, Culture, Literature, Sport, Education, Youth and Technology, reflecting the ways climate change intersects with everyday life.





The programme will extend beyond the main venue through city-wide and partner-led engagements, bringing climate conversations into communities, institutions, campuses, cultural spaces and neighbourhoods across Mumbai.

LOOKING BACK: MUMBAI CLIMATE WEEK 2026

The inaugural **Mumbai Climate Week 2026**, held from **17–19 February 2026 at the Jio World Convention Centre**, brought together government, business, civil society, academia, youth, international organisations and citizens, establishing Mumbai as a platform for climate dialogue and action rooted in the Global South.

The first edition featured **100+ partners, 400+ speakers from 30+ countries, 4,000+ attendees, 135+ curated events and 100+ climate solutions showcased**.

MCW 2026 also demonstrated the power of citizen participation and storytelling in making climate action more accessible — from citizen voices through VaartaVaran and youth-led initiatives to films, art and cultural interventions, including Civic Studios' *It's Only 47°C*, which brought the lived reality of extreme heat into the public conversation.
